ABRIDGED PROGRAMME REPORT 2020

The Context

In Nigeria, it is traditionally believed that a child with abnormal development is from the spirit world or a snake incarnate and will bring a curse on the family. Many children with disabilities such as down-syndrome, cerebral palsy, and other deformities in some communities are either buried alive or thrown into the river to return to the spirit world and as service of purification for the parents of such a child. This beliefs and practices have more negative effects on the psychological and social status of these parents.

The Sedoo Initiative for Children with Special Needs is registered by the Corporate Affairs Commission under Part "C" of the *Companies and Allied Matters Act 1990* as a not-for-profit, community-driven development and non-governmental charitable organization committed to an often neglected target group within the Nigerian society: vulnerable local children with special needs. (A child with a disability or a very special talent that would not be fulfilled without help). The initiative offers a non-profit program that focuses on improving the lives of special needs children and their families and is helping regardless of condition and needs. It provides succor for parents, professional help and information resource center on therapy, education and support with emphasis on 'Children with Cerebral Palsy.

In the last 40 years, the prevalence of Cerebral Palsy has risen to well above 2.0 per 1000 live births. Children with Cerebral Palsy and their ignorant families have over the years experienced neglect hence there seems to be no government, NGOs/CBOs or individual who have expressed specific interest in streamlining the special children for care and support services in Nigeria. The Sedoo initiative is making a difference in the lives of children with Cerebral Palsy within the North-Central geographical zone including Benue, Kogi, Nasarawa, Niger and Plateau states.

SECHILD was founded in 2011 by Kawan and Aondofa Anjira. Their involvement with Cerebral Palsy children began with the birth of their Daughter Sedoo in 2005 when she was

diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy and their Son Aondofa all born with Cerebral Palsy. Sedoo (to whom the organization is named) died at about two years while Aondofa died at about eight years. The absence of professional assistance and support centers for the specific condition of these children drove and inspired them to work for all children and families whose lives are forever changed by Cerebral Palsy.

SECHILD believes that individual differences in people are a natural part of life, and that disabilities provide children and adults with unique perspectives, insights and abilities which contribute to the overall well-being of society. The organization values children as the hope for the evolving improvement of humankind, and places great value on the family as a caring protector of children's vulnerability, as well as a catalyst for their healthy growth and development. The Initiative's teams' policies, training and practice promotes the message that no matter what a child's support needs, he/she has the same rights to life as every child.

We focus on a child's right to life and acceptance, strengths and assets – looking at what a child can do, training, caring and then working together to set plans to achieve set goals, and integration in the society.

Our Care Givers, key worker/s and our Children with special needs Centred Facilitators focuses on what is important 'for' children with special needs as well as re-orienting the society and people who see them as not deserving of life enabling their better, acceptance and care and a better society for children with special needs, their parents/care givers

- 1. A total of 20 children and their parents/guardians in FCT and environs are beneficiaries from the project.
- 2. Over 30 participants are direct beneficiaries of the project
- 3. About 50 affected families benefit indirectly.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER, 2020

1.0 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following are significant accounting policies applied through out the year in the preparation and presentation of the Financial Statements:

1.1 Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the basis of hitorical cost, unless otherwise stated and are on accrual basis.

1.2 Revenue recognition

a Sale of Goods

1

Revenue from sale of goods is recognised when the amount of revenue is measured reliably, it is propable that the economic benefit or Service potential associated with the transaction will flow to the Company, the significant risk and rewards of onwnership have been transferred to the purchaser, usually on delivery of Goods.

b Rendering of Services

Revenue from rendering of Services is recognised when it can be measured relably, it is probable that economic benefit or service potential associated with the transaction will flow to the Company, the stage of completion of the transaction as at the reporting period can be measured reliable and cost incured for the transaction and cost to complete the transaction can be measured.

c Grants

Grants from Donors for Projects are recognised on accrual basis when egibility for recognition are met.

1.3 Project Direct Cost

This represents expenditures incurred directly in the course of implementing Projects.

1.4 Cash & Its Equivalents

Cash & Its Equivalents comprises of cash in hand, cash at bank, call deposits and highly liquid investments with original maturity of three months or less, which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and subject to insignificant risks of changes in value.

1.5 Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of Cost and net realizable value. Cost is determined using FIFO while Net realizable is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of operation, less the estimated costs necessary to make the sale, exchange, or distribution.

1.6 Property, Plant & Equipment (PPE)

a Recognition Criteria

PPE is recognise when:

- -It is probable that future economic benefit or service potential associated with the item will flow to the Company
- The Cost or fair value of the item can be measured reliably
 - -The Company has control over item

All PPE are stated at Cost less Accumulated Depreciation. Cost here includes purchase price and other expenditures that are directly attributable to the acquisition of the item

b Depreciation of PPE

Depreciation on PPE is charged using Straight line method over the useful life of the PPE. The rates are as follows:
